

Operations & Safety Superintendent-Recruitment # 330

Job Summary

This is an Operations Superintendent position which will have a dual responsibility for the general administration of the Port's Safety programs and for the movement of cargo through the Port of Tacoma when assigned. This position will plan and coordinate labor and equipment requirements at marine terminal facilities, maintain communications with cargo and ocean carrier customers and their agents, U.S. Customs officials, USDA, USCG, Tugboat operations, the Port's customer service and maintenance departments. The incumbent will perform supervisory duties and responsibilities, cost analysis and support rate development.

Primary Functions

- Operations-Responsible for the safe movement of cargo through the Port of Tacoma. Plan and coordinate manpower and equipment requirements including responsibility for coordinating with the Port's Maintenance Department, and for establishing work schedules and priorities for the movement of cargo. Maintains communications with labor, customers, railroads, Port Security and government agents; facilitates vessel berthing and the efficient handling, storing, clearance and movement of cargo.
- Safety-Administers the organization's employee safety and health compliance
 programs, including the development of written safety and health plans, coordinating
 training and serving as the Port's subject matter expert on safety and health
 compliance issues. Issues regular reports as directed. Facilitate the Port's Safety
 Committee meetings, serves as the Port's primary representative in local and regional
 safety forums and coordinating all follow-on activities. Works with supervisors across
 the organization to identify potential hazardous working conditions and assists in the
 resolution of liability claims.
- Reporting-Prepares necessary reports and documentation in connection with the cargo
 movement. Communicates with the billing department regarding the movement of
 cargo under the Port of Tacoma tariff. Compile, analyze and maintain statistical data
 on cost and productivity for specific activities as required.
- Communication & Customer Relationships- Maintains effective working relationships
 with union leaders and appropriately administers union contracts. Maintain contact
 and updates with mainline railroads and Tacoma rail. Lead meetings and
 communication with key stakeholders and customers necessary to safely and efficiently
 move cargo through the Port.
- Supervision- Effectively supervises ILWU forepersons and supervisors involved in the movement of cargo. Supervises, manages and evaluates Railcar and Freight Coordinators.
- Other Projects-Develops methods of handling new commodities and devise improved cargo handling techniques and recommends capital improvements. Support other operational projects and duties as assigned.

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Required Education & Experience

Minimum education required is as follows: Bachelor's Degree from a Maritime Academy or in the area of business with specialization in transportation, safety or related disciplines.

Previous job experience required for this position includes a minimum of five (5) years as a stevedore, safety superintendent (or equivalent), maritime agent, operations superintendent or railroad operations. Experience working with cargo related labor force and shipping agent is required. Management experience in facilities and equipment maintenance is desirable. Five (5) years supervisory experience and knowledge of safety and health and hazardous materials standards and regulations is required.

Ideal Candidate

Must have knowledge of employee and industrial safety, health regulations and hazardous materials standards; particularly those affecting the maritime industry. The ability to maintain a positive working relationships with labor is also essential. Must also have knowledge of cargo operations, intermodal operations, rail operations, equipment and facilities maintenance operations and the longshore and ILWU, Local 22 contracts. Must be proficient in the use of Microsoft Office Software including Outlook, Word and Excel. Adhering to tasks and deadlines, with a demonstrated ability to prioritize, plan and deliver results according to schedule is a necessary attribute for success. The individual in this position must have excellent interpersonal skills. The incumbent must enjoy working in a team environment and across functional areas. It is also critical that the incumbent be an effective communicator with the ability to articulate concepts clearly and concisely. A professional demeanor with a desire to learn, take on new challenges and be open to constructive two-way feedback is a necessary characteristic for success in this role.

This individual must demonstrate a caring customer service attitude, a strong commitment to operational excellence and be able to display behaviors and a commitment to the organization's core values. 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Employment Eligibility
